

Terms of Reference: Tunisian Legal Expert to support in the deliverable of the “Comparative Handbook on Revenge Porn in North Africa: Tunisia and Algeria” - September 28, September 29.

Background and Context

The African Legal Think Tank on Women’s Rights is a Continental Legal Institute performing research, consultancy, capacity building, provision of technical expertise and advocacy on women’s rights. We are independent of government, political parties and other interest groups, and our mission is to provide space for discussion, to design and develop new concepts of quality through our analytical, constructive and evidence-based legal research into social, political and economic issues that affect the rights of women and girls in Africa.

In July 2020, the African Legal Think Tank on Women’s Rights obtained a grant from the Association for Progressive Communication (APC) as part of the “All Women Count - Take Back the Tech” Project. As a “Creative Intervention to address Online Gender-Based Violence”, the African Legal Think Tank on Women’s Rights will deliver a Comparative Handbook on Revenge Porn, investigating the issue in Tunisia and Algeria.

To ensure successful deliverable of the Research, we seek the support of a Tunisian Legal Expert to review the first draft of the Comparative Handbook and provide feedback on the developed recommendations.

Scope of Work

The Legal Expert is expected to:

- Review the first draft of the Comparative Handbook produced by the hired researcher;
- Review the recommendations addressed to the Tunisian Context drafted by the hired researcher;
- Advise the Researcher on the existing legal and regulatory framework, peculiarly on women’s rights in Tunisia;

This is a Home-Based Consultation. We expect to consult the Legal Expert on September 28 and September 29 for a couple of hours per day. We expect the consultant to be engaged during the presentation of the Comparative Handbook on October 30.
